Using your battery collection box is as easy as 1, 2, 3.

Step 1

Set up your box

Place it somewhere safe and easy to access.



Step 2

Fill with batteries

Collect used batteries and seal them safely.



Step 3

Return for recycling

Seal the box and send it back - return shipping is included.



Returning Your Batteries

Step 1: Check your return method

Visit members.closesthe-loop.com.au and click the "Collection Eligibility Tool" on the homepage. Enter your address to see if you qualify for free pickup or if you'll need to drop off at Australia Post.

Step 2: If you're in a courier collection area

Book your collection via the portal or by contacting customer support.

Step 2b: If you're in an outer regional area

Simply drop your box, using the pre-applied Australia Post label on the back - at your local post office, free of charge.



Accepted Batteries

Lithium, Nickel Cadmium, Nickel Metal Hydride, Lithium-ion, Lithium-ion polymer, Alkaline, Single Use Batteries, Rechargeable Batteries, Household Batteries, Medical Specific Batteries.



NOT Accepted items

Plastic, metal & glass, liquids, chemicals, food & garden organics, products exposed to radiation & chemical hazards.

Build the box.



1.

Lift the top cardboard flap. Open & remove the small box of ziplock bags from inside the box and liner bag. Retain these for isolation of batteries.

2.

Pull open the top flap in half & position into the slot above battery disposal.

3.

Open the "collect: batteries here" insert.

4.

Box is now ready to receive batteries.

5.

Collect batteries.

6.

Bag it or tape the terminals before placing in box.

7.

Place batteries in box until full or ready to ship.

Important Note: Place batteries in resealable bags provided inside the battery box. Multiple batteries may be placed into the same bag. If the battery does not fit in the zip lock bags provided, cover positive terminal with electrical or other non-conductive tape. If you have an oversized battery that cannot fit in the box, contact us at www.closesthe-loop.com.au

Secure & ship.

Lift the inner cardboard flap.

9.

Unfold the top liner, ensure the fire-resistant liner is in place, and make sure its zips are closed – then secure the velcro seal.

10.

Re-fit the inner cardboard flap. Close over the top cardboard panel. Fit closure tab into slot.

11.

Tape securely, depending on your area, book a pickup at members.closesthe-loop.com.au or drop off at your local AusPost office.
